ABOUT ESU

The English-Speaking Union runs a number of programmes bringing people from different countries together, including the International Public Speaking Competition (IPSC) for students aged 16–20, renowned as the Olympics of English public speaking. The ESU-Churchill Public Speaking Competition, sponsored by the International Churchill Society, is specifically for students in England and Wales. The ESU Youth Public Speaking Competition marks **the first ESU event for young people aged 6–16 worldwide**, aiming to nurture exceptional communication skills and cross-cultural understanding in young minds.

In April 2025, ESU and ASEEDER formed a strategic partnership to launch YPSC, bringing the spirit and standards of IPSC to a younger generation. Open to participants aged 6–16 worldwide, YPSC provides an international platform for public speaking, cultural exchange, and leadership development. In 2026, the ESU officially open the International Public Speaking Competition (IPSC) to participants from Macao, China, further expanding opportunities for young speakers to engage with the global public speaking community.

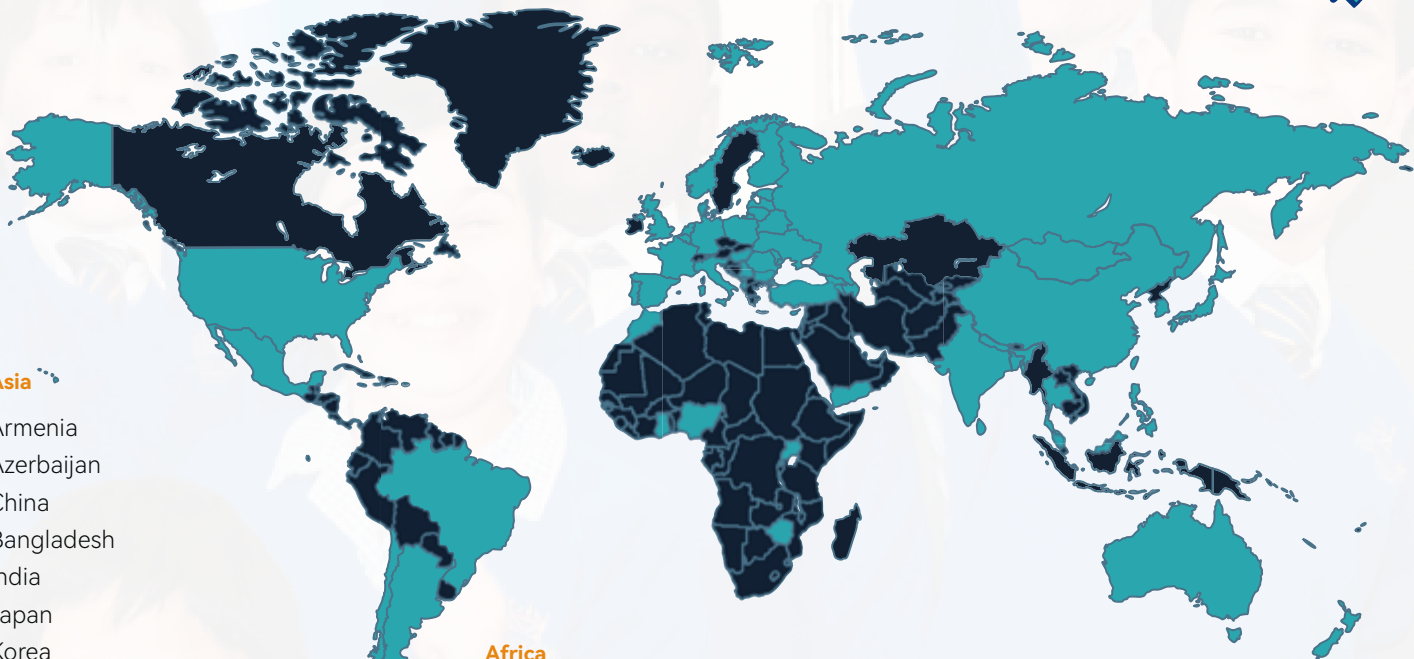

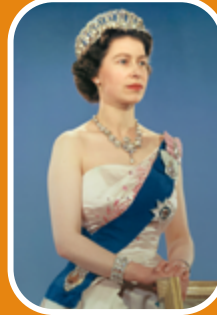

The prestigious ESU-Churchill Public Speaking Competition, sponsored by the International Churchill Society, is the largest such public speaking contest in England and Wales, **reaching over tens of thousands of students with around 400 schools.**



• SCHOOLS' MACE

The Schools' Mace, founded in 1957, is **the oldest and largest debating competition for schools in England and Wales**, involving **over 300 schools each year**. Teams typically hail from the UK's **elite secondary schools (including Eton College, Westminster Academy, and St Paul's Girls' School, etc.)**. Focus on Four Key Skill Sets

Improve Oracy Skills Comprehensively

Oracy is to speaking what numeracy is to mathematics or literacy to reading and writing -- It is a developable core skill. **ESU Youth Public Speaking Competition is based on four oracy skill sets: reasoning and evidence, listening and response, expression and delivery, and organisation and prioritisation**, empowering youth to express themselves confidently and fluently and enabling them to communicate effectively across cultures.

1 In many parts of the country, over **50%** of students start school lacking vital oracy skills.

2 Young people who cannot express themselves verbally may suffer from behavioural problems, emotional and psychological difficulties, and, in some cases, may descend into criminality.

1 Spoken language plays a key role in cognitive development, helping children understand the world around them.

2 **79%** of secondary state school teachers (almost 4 in 5) think that developing their students' confidence and competence in spoken language and listening skills would make the students more employable.

3 Children with good communication skills are four times more likely to get five A*-Cs at GCSE.

The ESU Youth Public Speaking Competition is a new international competition jointly launched by the ESU and ASEEDER for young people aged 16 and under around the world. The competition consists of three stages: the Online Preliminary Round, the Asian Round, and the Global Finals. As they progress through the stages, participants will develop confidence in expression, active listening skills, and a deeper understanding of diverse perspectives, gaining abundant opportunities to showcase their talents on an international platform. The Asian Round and the Global Finals will feature Public Speaking and Oracy Skills Workshops, led by renowned coaches and adjudicators from the ESU. These events provide participants with expert guidance and hands-on experience to further enhance their public speaking skills.

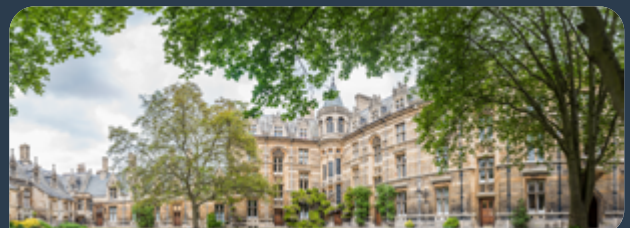
Global Finals

Evaluation Framework



Expression and Delivery: Speak with confidence, engage the audience.



Organisation and Prioritisation: Present their reasons in a clear, well-structured manner, give priority to the main arguments.



Reasoning and Evidence: Defend statements using clear, logical reasons, and choose relevant statements to defend.



Listening and Response: Engage with the ideas of others, respond, select, and respond to the most important arguments of others with precise analysis or questioning.

* Listening and Response skill will be assessed in the Asian Round and Global Finals.

VIDEO RECORDING REQUIREMENTS

YPSC

- 1. Language:** English
- 2. Format:** Online submission
- 3. Duration:** The required duration for the speech video differs by category. Generally, the speech video should not exceed the stipulated time. It is recommended for participants to rehearse extensively before recording to ensure the final submission adheres to the specified duration requirements.
- 4. Equipment Requirements:** A high-quality recording device (e.g., a smartphone, camera, tablet, laptop, or camcorder) is necessary. The device must remain stable throughout the recording process. During the assessment, the clarity and loudness of the expression will be considered; hence, external microphones are prohibited.
- 5. Environment Requirements:** Participants must be fully visible in the frame and ensure the examination space is well-lit and clear, with a quiet and non-distracting background. Recording in a bedroom is strictly forbidden.
- 6. Dress Code:** No fixed dress code. Participants may wear any comfortable clothing that facilitates movement. For speech segments involving props, participants can choose whether to use them. If props are used, please ensure your speech will not exceed the allotted time. Using props will not earn extra points.
- 7. Recording Requirements:** The entire speech video must be recorded in a single, uninterrupted take. Once recording begins, it cannot be paused and should only be stopped after the participant has finished all speech content. The speech video must ensure the synchronization of sound and video. No editing, either before or after recording. If the organizing committee detects any editing or clipping in the video, it will be deemed a violation of exam rules, resulting in the invalidation of the speech score.
- 8. Submission Regulations:** Participants are prohibited from submitting the same video multiple times (unless specifically requested by the organizing committee, such as due to technical issues affecting playback). Participants must not share the video on social media or use it for other examination purposes.
- 9. Submission Method (To be determined):** Submit your performance video and selected script via the ASEEDER Mini Program (Registration Projects → Upload Files). Before uploading, please first send both the video file and the script document through a WeChat chat, and then select them for upload from within the Mini Program.
 - Video file: MP4 or MOV format, maximum file size 500 MB
 - Script document: Word or PDF format, with the title of the script clearly indicated in the document.

Fee: 360 RMB / 420 HKD

Includes: Registration, assessment fee, certificate and medals. (Mailing charges are not included)

* After registration, you will receive a confirmation email, which includes reference academic materials.





Learning these skills at this age puts you in such a good position for the rest of your life. To have confidence in how to construct an argument, how to tell stories, how to interact with an audience, and how to feel grounded in your delivery, is always going to be an asset going forward.

More than that though, this competition allows participants to realise that there are people from halfway around the world who they may have more in common with than someone who's in the same class as them at home. You start to see all the richness of difference and diversity, and how valuable that is.
